**NOTES:**

1. Hepatitis B vaccination is required for work with human tissues, blood, or bodily fluids.
2. Hepatitis B vaccination is required for work with great apes (*e.g.*, chimpanzees).
3. Rabies vaccination and serologic monitoring of rabies titer is required for work with random source (Class B) dogs and cats, feral carnivores, bats, imported wild caught non-human primates while in quarantine, or the Rabies virus.
4. Q-fever titers are required for work with female sheep/goats (including the placenta, amniotic fluid, blood, or soiled bedding) or directly with the *Coxiella burnetti* organism.
5. Toxoplasmosis titers are required for females of child-bearing age that work with random source or feral cats
6. May be required for ABSL-2 or ABSL-3 work.
